Jakarta Investment Realization in Q1 2025



Jakarta's Q1 2025 Investment Realization Figure

JAKARTA (4/6) – Jakarta continues to solidify its position as Indonesia's leading investment destination, making a substantial contribution to the nation's economic expansion. In the first quarter of 2025, Jakarta achieved an investment realization of Rp 69.77 trillion, securing the top provincial ranking and representing 15.0% of the national total. This reflects a significant 19.5% year-on-year increase when compared to the first quarter of 2024.

Moreover, this robust performance was underpinned by balanced growth in both Domestic Direct Investment (DDI) and Foreign Direct Investment (FDI). DDI reached Rp 42.24 trillion, while FDI amounted to USD 1.72 billion, equivalent to Rp 27.52 trillion. Both DDI and FDI demonstrated notable year-on-year growth, increasing by 19.7% and 19.1% respectively. This growth indicates strong investor confidence, supported by an improving investment climate and post-election stability.

Furthermore, the growth was significantly driven by three key sectors. The transportation, warehousing, and telecommunications sector was the largest contributor, generating Rp 24.5 trillion, equivalent to 35% of the total investment. Following this, the other services sector contributed Rp 16.6 trillion, representing 24% of the total investment. The housing, industrial estates, and office buildings sector ranked third, with an investment realization of Rp 8.6 trillion, accounting for 12% of Jakarta's total investment.

In terms of regional distribution, South Jakarta recorded the highest investment realization in Q1 2025, with a total of Rp 26.9 trillion in combined DDI and FDI. Central Jakarta followed with Rp 12.8 trillion. Notably, South Jakarta also attracted the highest FDI, reaching Rp 16.8 trillion.

With this investment performance, Jakarta is committed to strengthening its investment ecosystem, thereby positioning itself as a competitive, resilient, and inclusive global city.
